advice (n.)	Nomen: <i>She gave me some good advice.</i>
advise (v.)	Verb: <i>She also advised me to read the book on geography.</i>
all ready (adj.)	Pronomen + Adjektiv: <i>When the teacher arrived, they were all ready to leave.</i>
already (adv.)	Adverb: <i>He has already left.</i>
affect (v.)	<i>What she said did not affect my decision.</i>
effect (n., v.)	<i>The headmaster effected many changes at his school.</i>
choose (v.)	Trotz gleicher Aussprache einmal doppeltes und
lose (v.)	einmal einfaches o .
desert (n.)	Wüste – Betonung auf erster Silbe
dessert (n.)	Nachtisch/Dessert – Betonung auf zweiter Silbe
moral (adj.)	moralisch – <i>a moral question</i>
morale (n.)	die Moral – <i>The morale of the citizens is low.</i>
quiet (adj.)	ruhig – Church should be a quiet place.
quite (adv.)	ziemlich, gänzlich – He is quite a clever boy for his age.
than (conj.)	Konjunktion bei Komparativen (<i>bigger than</i>)
then (adv., conj.)	Adverb oder Konjunktion (dann, danach): <i>I washed my face; then I combed my hair.</i>
their (pron.)	Possessivpronomen von <i>they</i> <i>The students gave their opinions.</i> <i>da, dort</i>
there (pron.)	<i>I'll be there on time.</i>
they're (pron. + short form)	Kurzform von they are <i>They're at the station now.</i>
weather (n.)	Wetter – <i>The weather suddenly changed.</i>
whether (conj.)	Konjunktion „ob“ – <i>She didn't know whether to leave or to stay.</i>
